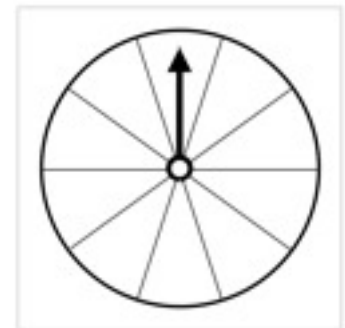
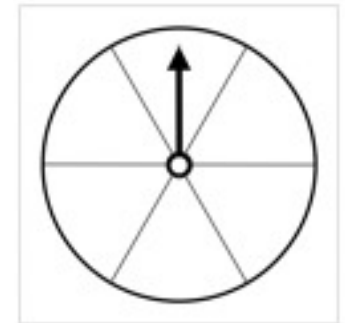
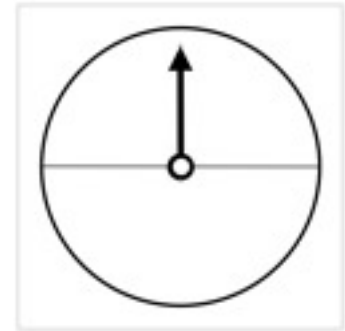
ASSEMBLY:

Cut out the spinner disks, using either the heavy bold line along the edge of the circle, or the dotted line along the edge of the rectangle, depending on what shape you want your final spinner to be. Cut out the arrow, sticking as close as you can to the shape of the arrow. Do not cut out the white center circle of the arrow.

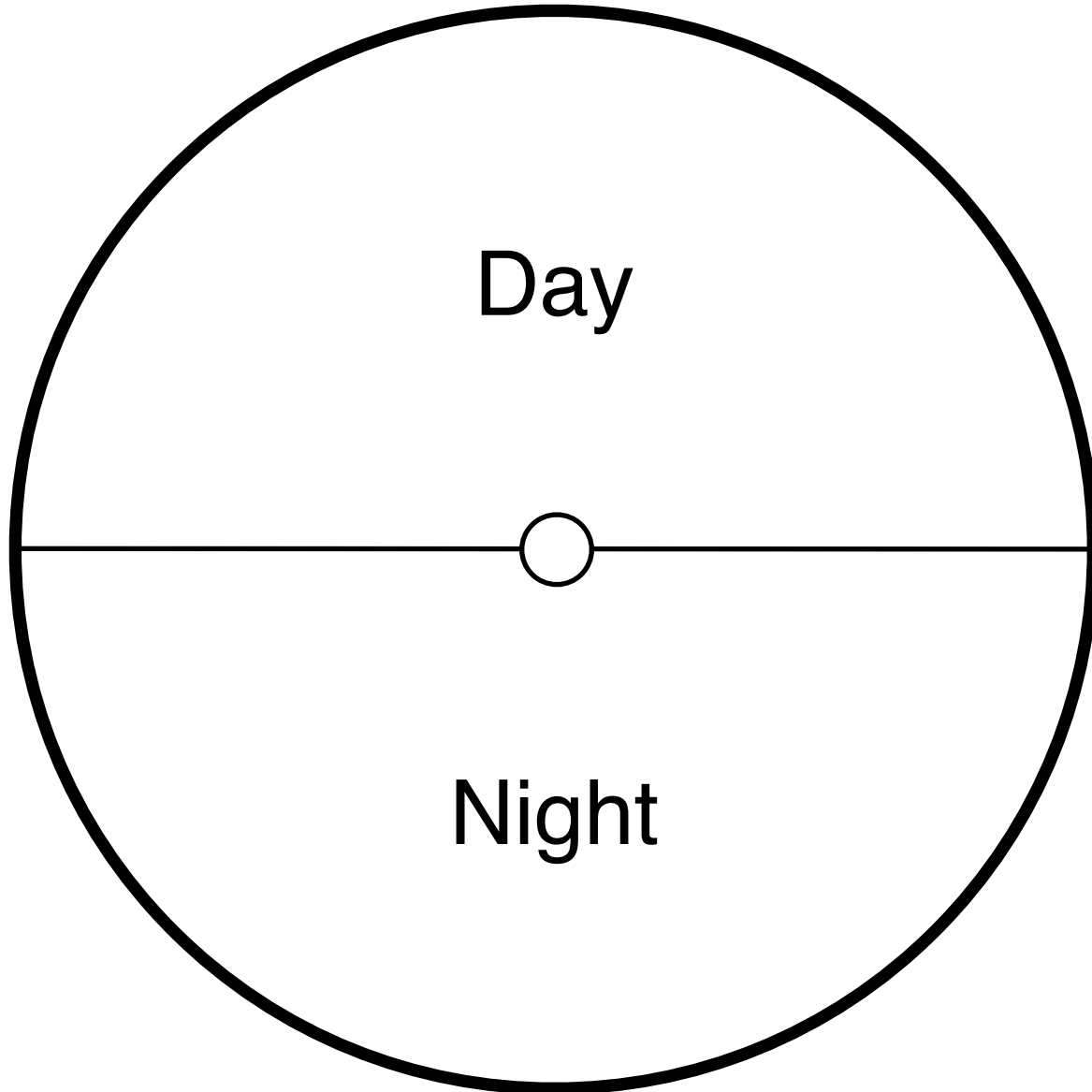
Use brass fasteners to attach the spinner arrows. Other ideas are using tacks, securing the whole thing to a corkboard or a cork hot pad for mobility. You can also use pins or pushpins, so long as you have something behind the spinner to catch the sharp end. Small squares of wood work, too. In that case, glue the whole spinner to the wood block.

HINTS FOR LONGER USAGE:

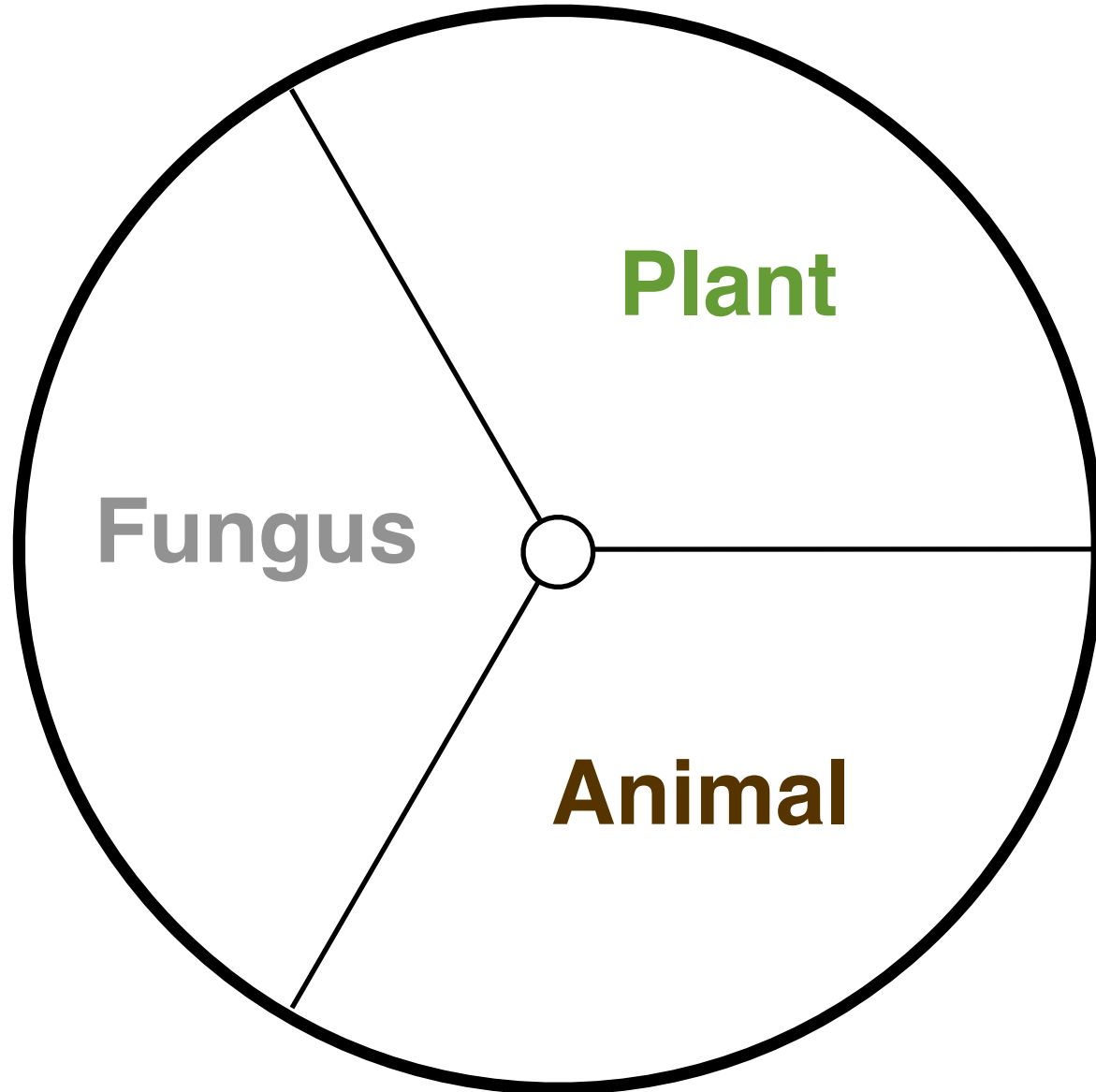
Use card stock or heavy gauge paper to make these last longer. You can also laminate them before assembly. Laminate film has the additional benefit of being able to take dry or wet erase markers, too. Permanent marker could also be used, but you need rubbing alcohol to take permanent marker off most laminate or glossy surfaces.



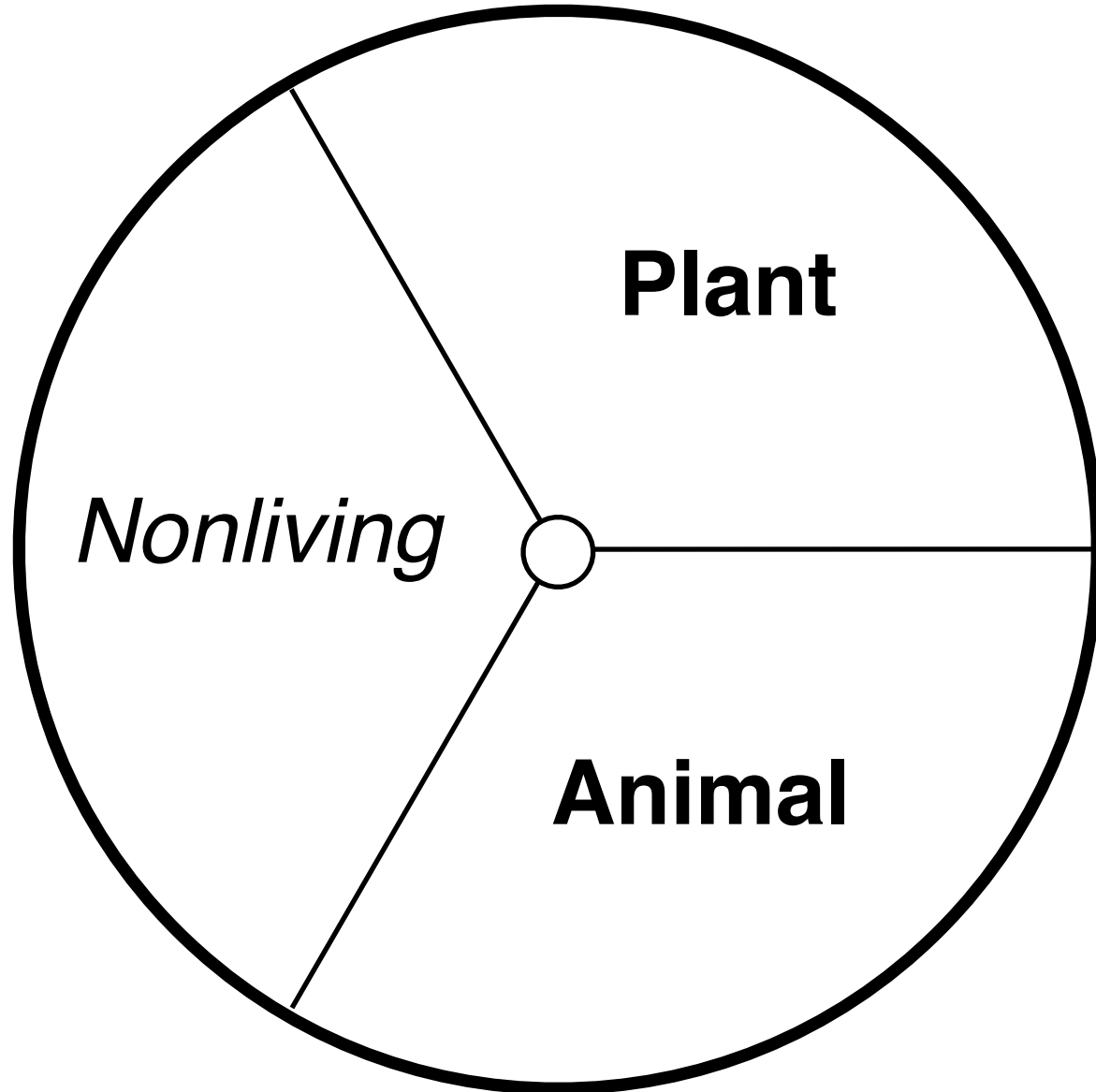
Night & Day Spinner



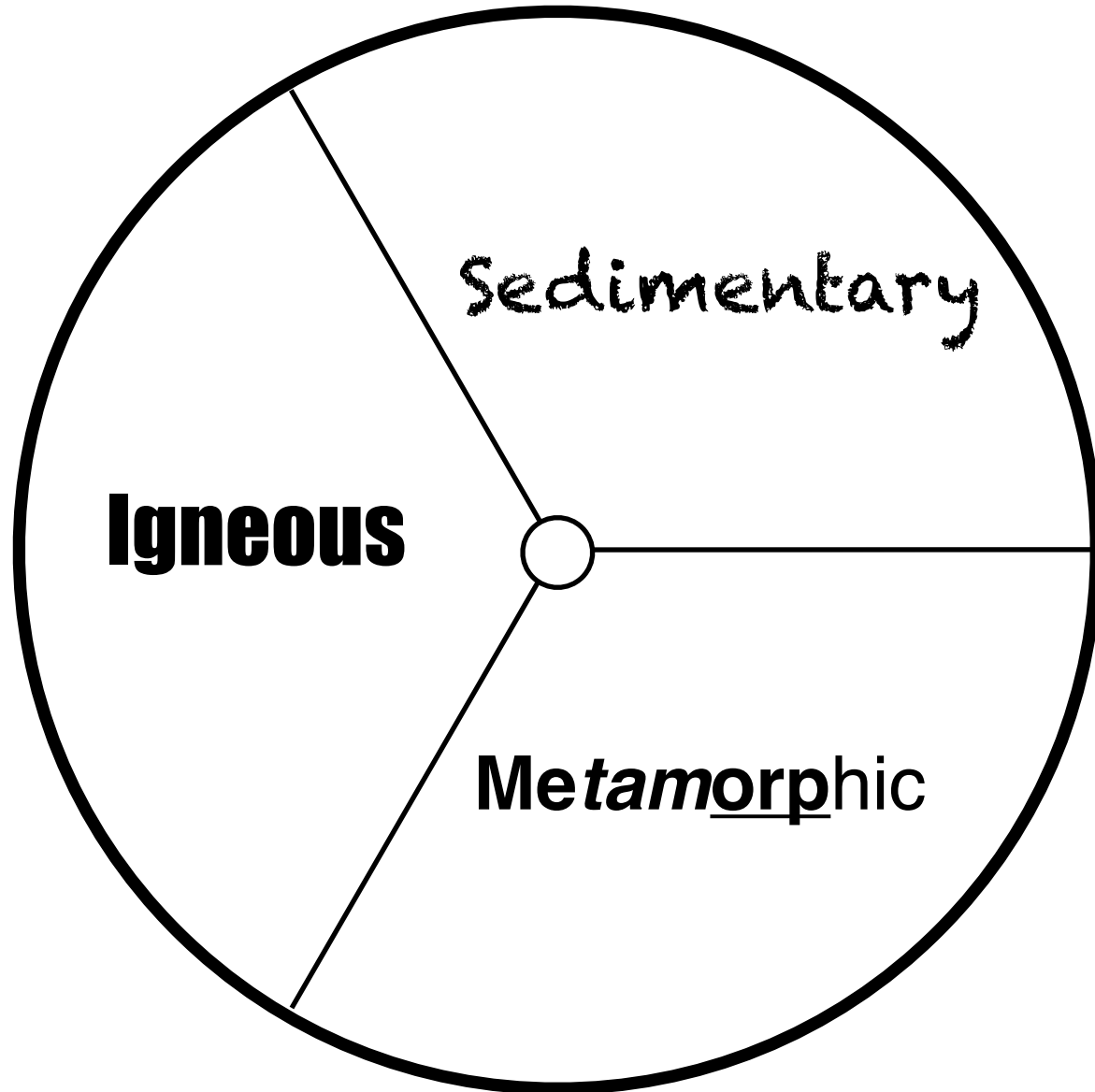
Living Things Spinner



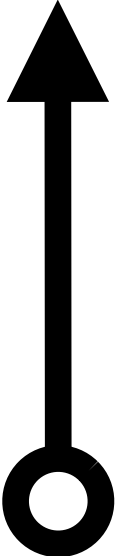
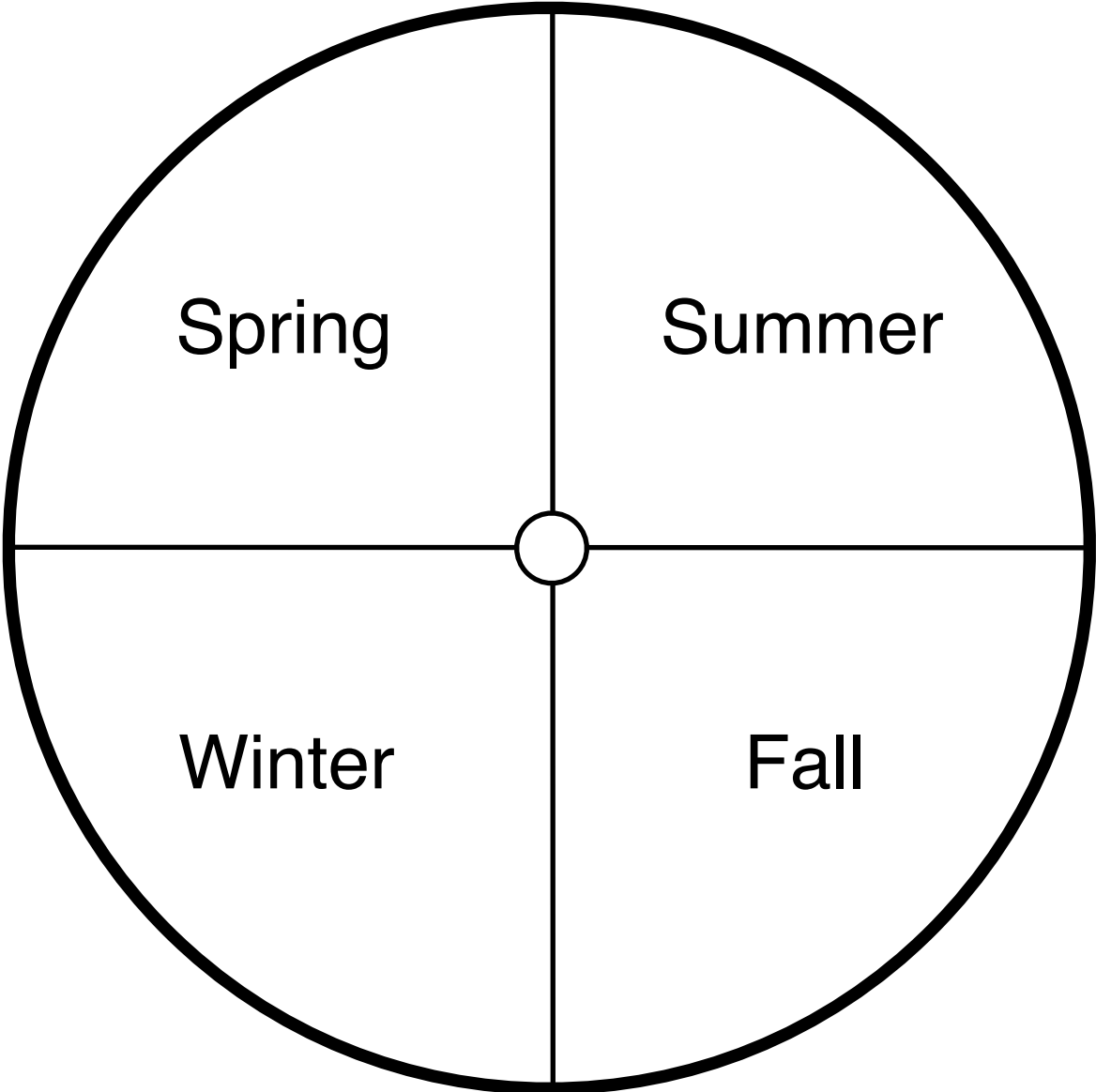
