SET-UP:

Print out 1 apple tree per child. Some have been provided in color or in B&W if you want to color them yourself.

Next, print out a sheet of apples. Use the color or B&W ones. Cut out one apple per family member. Write the family member's name or title on the apple. Example: write their actual name, like Robert, or write their family title, such as brother. You can add extra apples for pets or more distant family members, as desired.

Glue the apples on the tree.

ACTIVITIES:

- (1) Use the completed apple trees to compare families.
- (2) Use the apple trees to chart the amount of family members in multiple families.
- (3) Color-code apples to mean boys or girls or even pets.
- (4) Make extra trees for extended family members.
